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California Proposition 65 Compliance Statement

The State of California's Proposition 65, the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act, became law in November of 1986 contains labeling requirements for businesses to notify consumers with clear and reasonable warnings of potentially hazardous chemicals present in products. Warning labels are required on all products that contain chemicals found on the state's list of over 850 compounds and must specify that the product contains chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm. Warning requirements are dependent on the anticipated level of exposure to the Proposition 65 chemicals, which result from the foreseeable use of a product. The warning requirements will only apply if the foreseeable and intended use of a product containing these chemicals is likely to result in exposures that exceed the significant risk or observable effect levels.

storeWALL products are intended for use of storing and organizing common household tools generally kept in the garage and do not represent significant risk or observable effect levels as is referenced in California code, and thus storeWALL products do not require a Proposition 65 warning label.

The primary material used in storeWALL products are steel and PVC, but some of the lesser materials used in the manufacturing and assembly of storeWALL products may contain chemicals or materials which have been identified by the State of California and maybe on the official list. As noted, exposure levels are influenced by many factors, including the intended use or application of the product.
